UNC- Chapel Hill, Bell Tower Development Project

Construction of the Bell Tower Development project began in October of 2007 and lasted six years. The total construction cost was \$175 million. It was divided into several packages consisting of utilities, a parking deck, a chiller plant, central park, and the Genome Science Building. The division of these packages was dictated by the design schedule for each component, and logical sequencing of the infrastructure. Orchestrating the coordination and schedule for such a large-scale, multi-faceted project took knowledge, experience, detailed planning, and careful management.

The Bell Tower Development project was certified as an OSHA Building Star Site, and had a labor-hour total of 2,224,350. The last 1,720,000 hours were completed without a lost time incident, which was celebrated by the Department of Labor at the one million mark. At times, there were over 450 workers on the site, each having been through the safety orientation program.

This project was successful largely due to exceptional coordination and teamwork, including the fine work of sixty-three subcontracting companies that built this massive project. Thank you subcontractors!

The Lend Lease/Clancy & Theys JV Team shaped a HUB plan that enabled the project to achieve 18.1% participation. This was also the largest HUB participation for a State of North Carolina project of more than \$100 million.
