I received a request from Ms. Sally Hoyt, the Stormwater Systems Engineer at the University of North Carolina- Chapel Hill, concerning stormwater requirements for properties adjacent to the Carolina North site located within the Town of Chapel Hill (Town).

Under the Town's Land Use Management Ordinance, stormwater management controls are required for all new development, to include water quality, volume, and peak rate control measures. These requirements are applicable to properties adjoining the Carolina North site.
