



MIXED PAPER BIN

Includes: white paper (any color ink), cardstock, manila folders, newspaper, magazines, journals, post-it-notes, books, color paper, newspaper, and non-corrugated cardboard.



BOTTLES, CANS, & LAB PLASTIC BINS

Includes: aluminum/steel cans; aluminum foil/trays; plastic and glass bottles; glass jars; #2, #4, and #5 rigid, non-bottle plastic; pipette tip boxes. Do not include lab plastics that have contained hazardous chemicals.



CORRUGATED CARDBOARD

Break down and flatten. Place corrugated cardboard next to office trash or outside lab for removal by Housekeeping Services.

AEROSOL CANS

Store aerosol cans in a closed container labeled as "Used Aerosol Cans."



BATTERIES

All non-automotive batteries can be recycled. Segregate and pack separately: Alkaline batteries, Li (tape terminals), 9-Volt (tape terminals), Ni-Cad and Button Cell.



LIGHT BULBS

Includes: LED, fluorescent and projector light bulbs. Store all spent bulbs in closed boxes labeled as "Used Lamps" and date the container when the first bulb is put in.



PHOTOGRAPHIC SOLVENTS & FILM

Includes: photographic solvents and fixers, photographic film, x-ray film and microfiche.

PLASTIC FILM

COMPUTER EQUIPMENT

Take to Surplus Property. Furniture, office supplies and equipment, disks, CDs, DVDs, videotapes, scrap metal, and white goods can also be taken to Surplus Property. Surplus Property will pick up items if you fill out a form on the Procurement Services website.



PRINTER CARTRIDGES

You may recycle your printer cartridges by clearly labeling them and leaving them beside your campus mailbox. You may also give used printer cartridges for recycling to Staples delivery personnel when they deliver Staples orders.
